The Committee recommends *concurrence* in Resolution FIN-012 which reads as follows:

WHEREAS CLC Convention 2023 Resolution CS-005 was adopted. "Affiliates to the CLC get one delegate for 1000 or fewer members and one additional delegate for each additional 500 members or major fraction thereof."

WHEREAS PSAC CLC Convention delegates will be: NBoD = 24

Equity representatives/ Region with a minimum of 1 women/ equity group / region = 70

2/ equity group/ region - Women's, 2SLGBTQIA+, Racially Visible, Persons with a Disability, Indigenous representatives

2 Young Worker representatives/ Region with a minimum of 1 women/ region = 14

DCL Representatives/ Region with Equitable Academic and Non-Academic/ Region and minimum of 50% women/ region = 16

- 2 BC
- 2 Atlantic
- 2 NCR
- 4 Ontario
- 4 Quebec

Remainder of delegates will be distributed pro rata per component.

RATIONALE

The recent adoption of Resolution CS-005, at the Canadian Labour Congress (CLC) Convention 2023 in May 2023, amends Article 10 of the CLC Constitution. The adoption of this resolution changes the delegate entitlement of CLC affiliates from one delegate per local to one delegate for 1,000 or fewer members and one additional delegate for each additional 500 members or major fraction thereof. PSAC is an affiliate of the CLC, and therefore the PSAC delegate entitlement to CLC Convention is now approximately 220 delegates instead of the previous approximately 1000 delegates. This results in an approximate 75% reduction of PSAC delegates to the CLC Convention. This resolution seeks to ensure a clear, transparent breakdown of how the PSAC delegates to CLC Convention will be dispersed throughout the PSAC, ensuring representation and gender-based budgeting from all 5 equity groups, young workers, and DCL's, as well as Regional, National and Component representation at the CLC Convention. It is important to ensure representation at CLC Convention, to build a more diverse and inclusive labour movement, and to ensure leadership and decision-making structures reflect the diversity of our members and for all working people. The second BIR is the current funding model for PSAC funded delegates to CLC.
